We started the month off learning about fire safety. We practiced our large motor skills while doing the stop, drop and roll technique. The second week we learned about fall and leaves. We explored fun projects with cutting, gluing and the assortment of fall colors. We also talked about why the trees lose their leaves in fall. The third week we had fun with pumpkins. We looked inside and learned about how they grow. We learned the difference between Jack O' Lanterns and plain pumpkins. We learned about spiders and counted their legs. We talked about how they are helpful and not scary. Lastly, we weren't scared during trick or treat by playing with some friendly monsters.

### This Month's Preschool Skills

We will have a very busy month in November. First, we will have some scary Halloween fun making silly monsters.

Second, we will learn about shapes with scarecrows. We will learn why farmers use them. With the holidays fast approaching, we will work on table manners and practice eating nicely. We will learn about the different foods that we eat this time of the year and what food groups they belong too. We will have some fun with turkeys during the week of Thanksgiving. We will also talk about what it means to be thankful and what we are thankful for. Lastly, we will experiment with germs, learn what they are, and how we can keep ourselves safe from them. We will continue to write our names tracing them and as each child is ready, we will be slowly taking away the dotted lines. If you practice at home please remember: *First letter Upper Case and the rest of the letters Lower Case. We will also begin learning our letters in the alphabet beginning with the letters T and L. Your child will be working on center projects and worksheets to help them identify these letters.*
